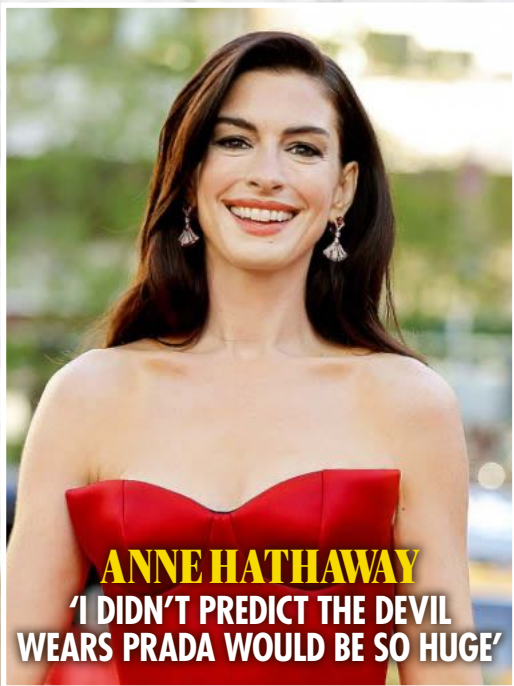

# MIA HAS FAMILY FUN AT THE RACES

Aintree Racecourse welcomed *The Tindalls* for Ladies Day as Mike and Zara stepped out in style with their daughter Mia

**M**ike and Zara Tindall are often credited with bringing a touch of informal fun to royal events - and it seems their eldest daughter Mia may be following in their footsteps. The 12-year-old often attends high-profile royal family gatherings with her parents, and has been seen sharing a giggle with Princess Charlotte and wearing outfits that match her mum's.

And it seems fashion isn't the only thing Mia shares with mum Zara. It appears she may have inherited her love of horseracing, too.

Zara and Mike are regulars at many of the major horseracing festivals in the UK, and earlier this month they brought Mia to Aintree for Ladies Day at the Randox Grand National Festival. The youngster looked grown-up in a pinstripe suit and was photographed cheering on the horses from the royal box.

Royal expert Jennie Bond exclusively tells *OK!* the snaps say a lot about Mia's relationship with her parents.

"Mia looks like a confident, happy young girl - a joy to see. Rather like George, she seems to have shot up and looks as if she might overtake her mum before too long," says the former BBC royal correspondent.

"She obviously has a great relationship with her parents. They clearly enjoyed sharing the thrills of the racing at Aintree: laughing, gasping, cheering and applauding together." ▶

Mia, who was born in January 2014, is the first child of Zara and former England international rugby player Mike, and is the late Queen's fourth great-grandchild. The Tindalls - including Mia's younger siblings, Lena, seven, and Lucas, five - live on Princess Anne's Gatcombe Park estate in Gloucestershire.

As Zara doesn't have a royal title, her children don't either. This dates back to when Anne, Princess Royal, the only daughter of the late Queen, gave birth to her first child, Peter Phillips, in 1977 and decided he would not receive HRH status or a royal title. The same went for Zara when she was born several years later in 1981, and this extended to Mia, Lena and Lucas, as well as Peter's daughters Savannah, 15, and Isla, 14.

But the Tindalls are still very much at the heart of royal family events. They often join Zara's uncle King Charles for the royal Christmas at Sandringham, where the younger Tindalls always seem to buddy up with the Prince and Princess of Wales and their children, with Mia once holding hands with Prince Louis on the way to church.

Jennie says, "I think the Tindalls run a very similar household to the Waleses - allowing the children a pretty free rein, with lots of noise and laughter along the way. With their rugby-playing dad, I'm sure there's been a lot of rough and tumble, and plenty of fun."

One of Mia's most memorable moments came 10 years ago, when the youngest members of the ▶

royal family gathered to celebrate the late Queen’s 90th birthday. As the monarch sat with her great-grandchildren and youngest grandchildren in front of celebrated photographer Annie Leibovitz, Mia picked up the Queen’s black Launer handbag. But rather than telling her to put it down, the Queen allowed the then two-year-old to keep hold of it, so she’s seen holding it in the family portrait.

Dad Mike said, “It just happened at the right time. She was being a bit naughty. The Queen got it quite right when she told her ‘just hold the handbag now’ and she did that. It ended up being a great photo of her. She’s got quite a little personality on her, and we encourage that.”

After Mia was born and before Mike and Zara welcomed their younger children, Zara suffered two devastating miscarriages. Podcast host Mike said, “The saving grace for us has been Mia, our

daughter. However down we feel, she will come running up in our faces. When I was playing [rugby], I hardly saw her. Now we can see her grow up.”

Mike and Zara have spoken out about their daughter’s love of sport - and it’s hardly surprising given their own successes in their respective fields. Zara is continuing with her illustrious equestrian career and earning sponsorship deals with brands such as Rolex. Mike, meanwhile, has retired from rugby but become something of a media personality, co-hosting a rugby podcast, having a hilarious Instagram account and taking part in *I’m A Celebrity... Get Me Out Of Here!*

Of course, in the immediate future, Mia will be finishing school before she decides on what career path she would like to follow in the future.

“Who knows what a 12-year-old is going to do with her life? If she’s anything like her mother, her ▶

grandmother and indeed her great-grandmother, horses could certainly play quite a big role. Could she continue the family tradition of riding in the Olympics for her country? Time will tell," Jennie says.


With Charles' slimmed-down monarchy currently looking slimmer than ever, many have suggested Zara and Mike are the perfect couple to draft in to help out with royal duties. In fact, in recent years, William has called on the couple to help out at Buckingham Palace garden parties that he has hosted.

Recent reports have suggested that when William takes the throne, he could hand Zara, and in turn Mike, an important role running royal horse racing matters - something he has less of an interest in than King Charles. But Jenny is not sure it's a role that will carry into Mia's future.

"There will be so many demands on William's time when he is King that I think it's a brilliant idea, if the

reports are to be believed, that he might hand over racing matters to Zara," she says. "Like her mother, she lives and breathes horses. She's also extremely glamorous and well-liked, and it would be a perfect fit.

"I think they will be a highly valued support for William when the time comes for him to be King. They are both very close to William, and if he calls on them again, as he did at a garden party last year, they will definitely agree.

"However, when it comes to Mia, I very much doubt that she will want to pursue a role as a working royal. Her parents have shown her how to be a valued and close member of the family without taking on an official role. I don't think any of them want to lose the freedom that their life choice has given them."

We pay tribute to the *Prince and Princess of Wales* as they celebrate their 15th wedding anniversary

**F**ifteen years of marriage is an achievement by anyone's standards, and after a difficult few years, the Prince and Princess of Wales have more reason to celebrate their love for one another than ever on their anniversary this week.

Last year they spent their 14th anniversary on the picturesque Isle of Mull in Scotland, and shared a romantic photo of themselves standing arm-in-arm as they enjoyed the spectacular scenery. The setting was a perfect choice given Kate's deep love and appreciation for nature, which has grown even stronger since her cancer diagnosis in 2024.

Their tastes have changed over the years, as they and their children have grown, and royal author Katie Nicholl says big romantic gestures and extravagant spending are not their style.

"They're not an over-the-top couple and they don't make a big fuss with ostentatious gifts for occasions like anniversaries," Katie tells *OK!*. "But they are still very romantic together and they will certainly want to mark the moment in some way."

While they are not known for their public displays of affection, we have seen them grow from a couple in the throes of early love into a deeply united ▶

partnership. In addition to raising three happy and healthy children, they have, particularly in recent years, provided unwavering stability for each other.

“As we know, the wider family doesn’t have a great record for long-lasting marriages, but William and Kate have obviously found something really special, and 15 years of marriage is something they can be very proud of,” says royal expert Richard Palmer.

“Whenever anyone who knows them is asked how they’ll celebrate, the answer is always the same: privately. They would both much prefer some family holiday

time or a private anniversary trip to any big public declarations.

“I can see them going somewhere that means a lot to them, possibly to Africa, or maybe to Mustique. They have probably sat down with their work diaries and the school holiday dates and worked out when they can do something together, and with the children. That time will be much more important to them than anything else.

“They’re both quite sentimental and after everything they’ve been through, with Kate’s illness and the many changes in the family, we could see them involving other family members too, maybe Kate’s ▶

parents, Carole and Michael, because they've been such a big part of their life together."

When it comes to gifts, William hasn't always hit the mark, and once hilariously recounted an occasion where he left Kate somewhat baffled by his choice of present.

"I did get my wife a pair of binoculars once - she's never let me forget that, that was early on in the courtship. I think that sealed the deal. It didn't go well," he joked on the *That Peter Crouch Podcast*.

"I tried to convince her - well I think I was convincing myself - about it. I was like, 'Yeah, but these are really amazing, look how far you can see.' And she's looking at me going, 'They're binoculars, like, what's going on?'"

He has made up for it in the years since, but Kate says he is still not the type to shower her with bouquets of flowers.

During a visit to a flower market ahead of Valentine's Day in 2023, Kate reportedly responded to a comment about the Prince of Wales "no doubt buying some red roses" by saying, "I don't think he will do."

For their 15th anniversary, he could choose a traditional gift made of crystal, which is meant to signify the fragility of a relationship and the care required to protect it.

"Couples often buy watches for each other at 15 years, instead of crystal, and I could imagine them seeing this as something sentimental but also useful, which would suit them," Richard says. ▶

While the binoculars did not quite go down as he'd hoped, William has a strong record of choosing jewellery for his wife. During their first Christmas as a married couple, he gifted Kate a pair of green amethyst oval drop earrings by London jeweller Kiki McDonough.

The engagement ring he proposed with - a striking blue sapphire and diamond ring - was seen on Princess Diana's finger on many occasions during her lifetime, and Kate has described it as "very, very special".

William is thought to have added a set of matching earrings to Kate's collection shortly before their wedding in 2011, which she is regularly spotted wearing.

To mark their 10th wedding anniversary in 2021, the couple worked with videographer Will Warr - who later shot Kate's heartfelt cancer update video - to produce a special film featuring George, Charlotte and Louis, who were then seven, five and three. The footage showed the family running on the beach, laughing in the sand dunes and toasting marshmallows on a campfire at Anmer Hall.

In the caption on social media, Kate said, "Thank you to everyone for the

kind messages on our wedding anniversary. We are enormously grateful for the 10 years of support we have received in our lives as a family."

The couple also enlisted photographer Chris Floyd to take two new official portraits to mark the occasion. Afterwards, Chris said, "In that time, they were just another pair of people that I was photographing. I just forgot where I was and who I was with and I was just photographing a couple, who in this case were celebrating their 10th wedding anniversary. There was no one else around. It was just me and them, and we had a really great time."

Whatever they do, there is no question that there is a lot to celebrate, royal broadcaster Katie says, adding, "They are very much still in love and united, and have been through things that could have broken a couple, and they deserve to celebrate together." **OK!**

# THE ROYAL WEEK

The royal family marked 100 years since the birth of Queen Elizabeth II and celebrated Prince Louis turning eight





## KING CHARLES & QUEEN CAMILLA

The King hosted a reception at Buckingham Palace last Tuesday to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth II's birth.

Queen Camilla, the Princess Royal, the Prince and Princess of Wales, and the Duke and Duchess of Edinburgh were also in attendance, joined by the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester, the Duke of Kent and Princess Alexandra.

Representatives from many of the late monarch's patronages, including Cancer Research UK, the Royal Kennel Club and the Army Benevolent Fund, also paid tribute. Later, the King gave birthday cards to people also turning 100 on the day.





## KING CHARLES

Also on Tuesday, the King met TV presenter Claudia Winkleman and artist Dame Tracey Emin as he, Queen Camilla and the Duke and Duchess of Edinburgh visited the British Museum to view the final design recommendations for the Queen Elizabeth Memorial.

The bronze sculpture, by Martin Jennings, will be based on a 1955 portrait of the 28-year-old Queen and will be accompanied by a smaller sculpture of her husband Prince Philip.

Earlier in the week, the King and Queen visited the Queen Elizabeth II: Her Life In Style exhibition at The King's Gallery, Buckingham Palace. ▶





## PRINCE LOUIS

The Prince and Princess of Wales released a charming video of their youngest son, Prince Louis, playing on a beach in Cornwall to celebrate his eighth birthday last Thursday.

# ‘I didn’t predict the movie would be so huge’

*Anne Hathaway* on her love for Meryl Streep and why she thinks fans will go wild for *The Devil Wears Prada 2*

It’s the sequel fans have been waiting 20 years for – yet no one is more excited about the release of *The Devil Wears Prada 2* than its star, Anne Hathaway.

The 43-year-old, who returns as writer Andy Sachs, teases, “It’s everything anyone who loved the first one could have wished for and more. It’s really exciting to be able to share the story because it’s so good.”

But it’s not just the plot getting Anne excited. She was thrilled to be reunited with Meryl Streep, who plays Andy’s ex-boss, the formidable Miranda Priestly.

“It was just the best,” Anne says of working with Meryl, 76, again. “I was 22 when we did the first one. I thought she was the greatest living actress then and, 20 years later, she still is. I’ve been lucky to work with so many wonderful people over the past two decades but there’s no one like Meryl Streep. She is amazing. It was so easy for us to pick up with these characters again after so long.”

While Anne rightly considers Meryl one of the all-time greats, Anne is certainly up there too. Since making her film debut in 2001 in Disney’s *The Princess Diaries*, Anne has gone from strength to strength, winning an Emmy, Golden Globe and Oscar, which she nabbed for her role as Fantine in the 2013 adaptation of *Les Misérables*. More impressively, she did it with just 15 minutes of screen time.

Growing up in New Jersey, Anne longed to be on screen. It was her mother Kate, an actress herself, who

worried about her daughter following in her footsteps. She needn’t have panicked. By the time she was a teen, Anne had starred in multiple plays, and aged 19, she won the life-changing part of Mia in *The Princess Diaries*.

“I can’t describe the honour of knowing that I’m involved in the moments where people need comfort,” Anne said about her choice of career. “It makes me really excited that my journey as a performer has connected with people.”

It’s safe to say fans truly connected with her role as Andy. The anticipation for *The Devil Wears Prada 2*, in which Andy returns to fictional magazine *Runway*, where Miranda is still in charge, is off the scale. Anne explains why it’s taken two decades to reunite the colleagues, which also includes Emily Charlton, played by Emily Blunt and Nigel Kipling, played by Stanley Tucci.

“It just took a while to come up with the right script,” she says. “We all wanted to know what happened to these characters and I know there were a few ideas for a sequel. So it’s taken a while but it makes perfect sense to pick up the story 20 years later.”

Anne has fond memories of making the first movie and admits the legacy of the film is quite scary to live up to.

“Back then I didn’t predict the movie would be so huge, I don’t think any of us did,” she says. “We all knew it was special, but no one could have known the ▶

reaction that was to follow. Going into this one, the level of interest has been incredible. People have grown up with the first film, with these characters and there's a lot of responsibility that comes with that. This time felt different because of that but the same quality is still there. It's the right story with the right people at the right time."

Since the first film was released, a lot has changed for Anne, not just professionally. She's now happily married to businessman Adam Shulman, but has kept a tight lid on her private life. Her caution could well stem from her ill-fated romance with Italian housing developer Raffaello Follieri, who she dated from 2004 to 2008. He was sentenced to four and a half years in jail for fraud following their split, and as part of the FBI's investigation, Anne's private diaries were seized from his house.

Years later, Follieri recalled speaking to Anne on the phone one last time on the night he was arrested. He said, "If I remember, Annie's last words were 'I love you forever' and we ended the call. That was 2am on June 24, 2008. At 6am I was arrested. I never spoke to Annie again."

Anne, meanwhile, threw herself into her career and, thanks to roles in films such as *Interstellar*, *One Day* and *The Dark Knight Rises*, she's been named one of the highest-grossing actresses of the 21st century.

But the biggest role in her life is being a mother. After marrying Adam in 2012, the pair welcomed two sons,

Jonathan in 2016 and Jack in 2019, who she's keen to keep out of the public eye.

"It's my family, and it's not just about me," she said. "My family has needs, and one of the needs of children is that they need to be able to define their own lives."

That said, if her boys wanted to follow her into acting, she'd take a leaf out of her own parents' book.

"I'd probably take the same tack that my parents did with me, which is, 'You have all the time in the world to be a professional actor, you can only be a child once,'" she said. "So I'd encourage them to study, to go to classes, to read, but I'd strongly discourage them from starting too young," she continued. "I think they'll be in a position where they'll be able to go to college and figure out where they want to go from there."

If her sons are anything like their mum, there will be no stopping them. For Anne, despite all her stellar roles, *The Devil Wears Prada* will always be her signature movie, and even now fans quote lines to her.

"I get that a lot," she smiles. "It happened a lot after the first movie and it's happened ever since. I get 'a cube of cheese' a lot. 'I am one stomach flu away from my goal weight' comes up a lot too." **OK!**

# TALK OF THE DEVIL

The stars of *The Devil Wears Prada 2* hit the red carpets in New York and London for two equally glittering events

It was a tale of two premieres last week as the publicity machine for *The Devil Wears Prada 2* stepped up a gear, with star-studded launches in both New York and London.

After dazzling in the Big Apple in a strapless red Louis Vuitton gown, Anne Hathaway went for a more risqué premiere look for the movie's European launch, held in central London last week. ▶

The Oscar-winning actress took to the red carpet in a flesh-flashing Versace corset dress, which featured tuxedo-style lapels and sheer panel cut-outs, which accentuated its vampy look.

The attention-grabbing outfit almost stole the show at the Leicester Square premiere, which saw Anne - who returns as Andy Sachs in the sequel - cosying up to co-stars Meryl Streep (wearing Prada, naturally), Emily Blunt and Stanley Tucci, who are all reprising their original roles.

Celebrity fans of the first movie, released 20 years ago, were out in force at the premiere, where a red, white and black dress code made for a truly striking evening.

TV golden couple Marvin and Rochelle Humes looked perfectly coordinated, while renowned designer Donatella Versace - who makes a cameo in the new film - wore a black off-the-shoulder number and was seen sharing a joke with Anne on the red carpet.

Another couple getting it just right were Ercan Ramadan and Vicky Pattison, with the *Strictly* star's stylish black dress almost certain to win the seal of approval from fearsome *Runway* magazine editor-in-chief Miranda Priestly.



One pair who clearly didn't get the black and red memo were Damian Hurley and his pal Trinny Woodall. Cosmetics guru Trinny opted for an A-line floral dress by Prada, while Damian went shirtless under a loose blue suit. TV presenter Laura Whitmore also made a strong style statement, showing off her blooming baby bump in a black, midriff-baring gown.

Earlier in the week, at the New York premiere, the woman who is widely reported to have partially inspired the character of Miranda - legendary *Vogue* editor Anna Wintour - stepped out in her trademark bob and dark glasses as she joined the movie's stars, Anne and Emily, at the Lincoln Center event.

Carefully navigating the red carpet in a feathered sculptural dress by Schiaparelli, Emily held hands with her husband, actor John Krasinski, and her sister, Felicity Blunt - who is married to her *Devil Wears Prada* co-star Stanley Tucci.

When it comes to high fashion, it's clearly a family affair. **OK!**

Jockey *Harry Skelton* and his wife *Bridget Andrews* invite us into their sanctuary away from the racetrack

**T**op jockey Harry Skelton and his wife, former jockey Bridget Andrews, live in a beautiful country home in Warwickshire with their two young children and, of course, lots of horses. It was built on the site of a former horse paddock and is close to Harry's equally famous horse trainer brother Dan's racing yard.

As they welcome *OK!* onto the sprawling grounds for an exclusive look into their day-to-day life, it is a rare excuse for the couple to swap their wellies and jodhpurs for something less practical.

"It's so lovely to get glammed up," Bridget, 32, says as she admires her glamorous outfit. "But honestly? I'm in my comfort zone in leggings and a jumper. That's our day-to-day."

The couple are parents to five-month-old daughter Anna and son Rory, who turns two on 27 April and is already a character, according to his dad. Unfazed by the camera crew, Rory shouts "cheese" every time he looks at the cameras as he toddles past leading a white pony called Barley back to the stables, chatting away to him softly.

Harry, 36, and Bridget moved into the house in 2024, just three weeks before Rory was born.

"We're lucky," Harry says fondly, as he surveys the land outside their living room window. "We're well back off the road, we've got fields out front looking over the horses, and fields at the back. We always wanted a family to enjoy it and we're very lucky we've got two little ones now." ▶

Bridget adds that the family spend most of their time in the kitchen, after discarding their riding boots in the boot room which connects to it.

The couple have won a dizzying number of medals between them and Harry was crowned British Champion Jump Jockey in the 2020-2021 season. There is evidence of their passion throughout the home, from the numerous framed pictures of race wins to the David Power Jockeys’ Cup Harry won in 2025 and the rocking horse in Rory’s bedroom - an exact replica of Harry’s horse Protektorat.

Even the wallpaper in their bathroom is made up of newspaper articles about the various races which they have taken part in.

There are three horses in their stables at the moment, including point-to-point hunter Midnight River. But if you add those to all the ones at Dan’s racing yard up the road, there are around 200 in total.

“Since having Anna, I don’t ride as much as I used to,” admits Bridget, who stopped competitive racing during her pregnancy with Rory. “Once our two get older, I’m sure they’ll have horses for pleasure.

“With one you can go everywhere. It’s not quite as easy with two. But we always wanted children, that’s the sacrifice you make, until they’re up a bit.”

We’re slap bang in the middle of racing season right now and Harry admits their schedule is hectic. “I’ve just done Aintree. If I’m racing on a specific day, I’m out the door early and might not return until seven at night,” he explains. “I try to nip back. We’re lucky that a lot of races are only two hours away. In midwinter it’s fine - I’m generally back by five-ish. Otherwise, it’s pretty full-on.”

Thankfully, there is calm in among the chaos. Bridget tells us, “This morning Anna was asleep, but I took Rory out and we were up on the gallops ▶

at half past eight, watching Harry. Rory adores hanging out with his dad and his uncle. He spends so much time around horses. It’s a beautiful, outdoorsy childhood.”

Horses must be in their DNA, and Harry confesses it’s something he and Bridget joke about.

“We don’t really know a lot else,” he admits. “We don’t want to force it, but we like to think our kids will take the same route as us one day.”

Family life and racing are deeply entwined for these two. Indeed, Harry had to rush home to welcome his firstborn two years ago, as he was in Surrey for the Jump Finale at Sandown Park Racecourse. But Bridget never had a second thought about her husband juggling both.

“I knew he was going to go – that was fine. It’s what we do. I knew he would be with me as soon as he could,” she says.

Being from horse racing backgrounds, she adds, means they understand the pressures of that world better than anyone outside it ever could.

“We have had to miss family events,” she reflects. “But if you don’t go racing one day and ride a ▶

winner, the next person gets on that horse and you've lost your job. You have to earn your living. But racing also gives you some of the biggest highs imaginable."

Harry adds, "It's relentless, but you've got to be passionate or it's not going to work. I'm even more driven now, because I've got a family to support.

"Bridget's obviously not riding right now. She's got a bigger job raising our kids. But being a jockey is a career of absolute love. We've got a lot of good days ahead."

The couple's love story began with a chance encounter at the races. Bridget says, "My sister is actually married to Dan's best friend. I was young, not quite 18, when I met Harry."

Was it love at first sight? Bridget laughs, but Harry swiftly interjects. "Absolutely!" he insists. "We were in the jockeys' tea room. I spotted her, we got chatting and it went from there."

Harry is part of an incredible family legacy, with his brother Dan a top trainer and his father Nick an Olympic showjumper. Asked about his memories of growing up, he gets emotional, recalling his dad's big moment at the Rio Olympics.

"To us, Dad was just Dad, but he was always very driven. He had to wait 58 years to win an individual gold in Rio in 2016. I remember that day so clearly. I was a mess. I actually broke down in tears," Harry says.

"I knew that was all he ever wanted, and that it was probably his last chance as well. His passion set us up for success, really." ▶

## ‘QUEEN ELIZABETH EXCITEDLY ASKED MY DAD ABOUT HOW HIS HORSE WAS BRED’

Bridget, originally from near Luton, also grew up with ponies in the yard, but much as she loves it, she tells us that her racing days are over.

“We were both doing a high-risk job. I’ve had my injuries and was lucky enough to walk away in one piece. Once you have kids, you have these little people who rely on you and need you at home every night. When you become a jockey, you know at some point you’re going to have injuries, but it’s not fair on them. I’ve had a great time, but now I’m loving being a mum,” she says.

The royals are famously passionate about their horses. Harry has received trophies from Princess Anne and knows her daughter, Zara Tindall.

“Zara is just a lovely, down-to-earth person who loves horses,” he says. “My dad met the late Queen Elizabeth. He remembers her asking him excitedly all about how Big Star, his horse, was bred. They have that passion.”

Away from the racing world, what do these two do for fun? “Point-to-point,” laughs Bridget, referring to a form of amateur horse racing. “It’s what friends and family do. It’s a nice way to catch up with everyone.”

Harry is also a cycling enthusiast, but admits it’s the joy of not having to go anywhere that he relishes most. “A rare day at home is the best,” he says. “We enjoy simple pleasures, like taking our kids out with our two whippets, Milo and Woody.”

Could either of them imagine a different life - perhaps sitting behind a desk? They both look instantly horrified. “Absolutely not!” Bridget declares. “This life is in our blood.” **OK!**

# ‘Ronnie was my one true great love – I adored him’

Organic queen *Jo Wood* on dating after life as a rock chick, living off-grid and the inspiration behind her novels

**J**o Wood is widely considered to be the ultimate rock chick, having been married to Rolling Stones guitarist Ronnie for 24 years, and together as a couple for three decades. During their love story, they welcomed children Leah, 47, and Tyrone, 42, as well as Ronnie’s son, Jesse, 49, with his first wife, Krissy Findlay, and Jo’s son, Jamie, 52, from her first marriage to Peter Greene.

Unsurprisingly, Jo reveals that life on the road with the Stones – with four kids in tow – meant there was rarely a dull moment, as they rubbed shoulders with all the music greats, including Tina Turner and David Bowie.

Despite Jo and Ronnie divorcing in 2009, after he cheated on her with waitress Ekaterina ‘Katia’ Ivanova, the pair remain on good terms.

Jo, 71, is currently single, although Ronnie got married for a third time in 2012 to theatre producer, Sally Humphreys, now 48, with Sir Rod Stewart acting as best man, and Sir Paul McCartney also in attendance.

Discussing whether the 78-year-old musician was her one great true love, Jo confesses, “Yes, I’m sure of it.”

However, she’s not sad they’re no longer an item. “We had over 30 years together,” she explains. “I adored him, and I still love him, but I’m not in love with him. We had a great time together. We’ve got great kids together and wonderful grandkids, and I loved our life.”

Her advice for those missing their exes is to keep them at arm’s length. “Don’t see them often!” she says. “I only see Ronnie at weddings and birthdays, and we don’t have a family WhatsApp group.”

Jo appeared on Channel 4’s *Celebrity First Dates* in 2016, hoping to find a romantic connection, but to her amusement, the producers set her up with a Ronnie lookalike. She has toyed with one or two boyfriends since her divorce, but discloses that she’s firmly in her single girl era.

“My kids say it’s because I’ve isolated myself by moving out to the country,” she says. “But I think if I meet someone, it’ll be when I’m out and about.”

Fortunately, Jo is one of the select celebrities to have been accepted onto exclusive dating app Raya, of which Ben Affleck and Lewis Hamilton have also been members in the past.

“I’m still on Raya, but I’ve not got a single hit!” she exclaims, with a laugh. “I think they look at my age and say to themselves, ‘I don’t want an old bird.’ I hardly ever look at it these days, but Tyrone met his now-wife on it, so you never know.”

Jo and Ronnie’s son Tyrone married Faye – the daughter of Iron Maiden bassist Steve Harris – two years ago in County Kildare, after matching on the app.

Six years ago, Jo decided to sell her Primrose Hill

home and move off-grid to a Grade II-listed farmhouse in rural Northamptonshire – something she had always dreamed of.

Her new abode operates without mains services and uses a 200ft borehole for water, and solar panels and generators for electricity, with an emphasis on organic, sustainable living. Yet the former fashion model insists she’s never too far from the bright lights of the big city. ▶

“I’m back and forth to London all the time,” she says. “I’m staying in London this week because I’m giving a speech for Homeopathy UK. They’ve given me a hotel room for the night.”

Despite her rock ‘n’ roll image, Jo overhauled her lifestyle in the early 1990s and committed to following an organic diet, after she was misdiagnosed with Crohn’s disease for two years. It later came to light that she actually had a perforated appendix, but the whole experience prompted her to eliminate processed foods, farm her own vegetables and even launch her own organic skincare range, Jo Wood Organics.

The ex-*Strictly* star openly shares her secrets to looking as glamorous as ever in her seventies.

“I get Profhilo. In fact, I’m due to have it again soon,” she says, of the injectable treatment used to hydrate skin, promote collagen and stop sagging. “I’ve stopped taking Botox because I heard it can cross the blood-brain barrier.

“I eat very healthily, and I don’t drink often these days, but when I do, I drink tequila. I also take lots and lots of supplements.”

Pressed on what pills she swears by, she says, “I go to a great naturopathic doctor, and he tells me what to take. I have turmeric, quercetin, chlorophyllin and all those sorts of things.”

Also putting a spring in her step is the news that Jo’s stepson, Jesse, is going to be a father again with his new partner, ex-*Made In Chelsea* star Gemma Gregory.

Jesse announced his separation from TV presenter, Fearne Cotton – with whom he shares two children – in December 2024, following 10 years of marriage. He confirmed his new relationship with Gemma, 40, on social media last April, and the pair recently revealed they are set to become parents.

Opening up about the impending arrival, Jo says,

“They are so much in love that I wasn’t surprised at all. He just texted me and said, ‘Jo, I’m having another one.’ It’s great and I’m very happy for him.”

Asked if she’s been in contact with his ex-wife, Fearne, Jo says, “No, I actually haven’t spoken to her since, but if she wants to call me, I’ve got nothing against her. I’m good friends with [Jesse’s first wife] Tilly. I adore Tilly, but I’ve known her for so long.”

Musing on her love of babies, Jo says, “Oh, I’d love to have had more, but I was too busy rocking and rolling. My Pilates teacher had a baby six months ago, and yesterday I saw her little one and I just wanted to cuddle her. She was lovely.”

Last year, Jo published her first novel, *The Resurrection Of Flo*, about a woman rediscovering life after divorce. It was recently released as an audiobook.

Pressed on whether the protagonist is based on herself, Jo says, “Not really. She’s a redhead and an actress, but of course some of the stories are inspired by people I know. I have to get my inspiration from somewhere and turn it into Flo’s life.”

She revealed on *Loose Women* that she initially started writing the book on her mobile phone, but has since invested in a laptop.

“When I get an idea, I immediately go to the notes in my phone and start jotting them down,” she says. “It helps remind me of the story. I’m now writing my second novel, a follow-up to *The Resurrection Of Flo*. It’s going to be called *Only Flo*.” **OK!**

# ‘I’m glad I took a break to focus on my family’

*Cameron Diaz* on shunning Hollywood for her kids, getting back in the saddle with Keanu Reeves and navigating the pitfalls of fame

Last year Cameron Diaz returned to Hollywood following a 10-year hiatus, in which she’d spent precious time with her husband, Good Charlotte rock star Benji Madden and their two children, Raddix and Cardinal.

However, the extended break certainly hasn’t done her any harm. Instead, since bursting back onto our screens in the 2025 comedy film *Back In Action*, Cameron has barely had a chance to catch her breath, booking multiple projects, including a new romcom, another action comedy and *Shrek 5*, where she’ll reprise her role as Princess Fiona.

But first she’s starring alongside Keanu Reeves in the new Apple TV film *Outcome*, about a fictional actor, played by Keanu, whose nice guy reputation is put at risk when he’s blackmailed with a damaging video.

And once she was back in the game, Cameron just couldn’t wait to get started.

“To be able to still do this at such a high level with people like Keanu Reeves is a thrill for me,” she says. “I’m glad I took a break and I was able to focus on family and a part of my life that means so much to me but I still love doing this. It’s the best job in the world.”

It may be her dream career, but Cameron’s

life is undoubtedly all about her family. Since welcoming daughter Raddix, six, and two-year-old son Cardinal, Cameron has waxed lyrical about motherhood, specifically becoming a mum for the first time at the age of 47.

“I love being a mother. It’s the best, best, best part of my life,” she said. But in a separate interview she admitted that the pressure was on to stay healthy, given that she’s now 53, with a sprightly toddler.

“The only pressure for me now is I have to live to be, like, 107, you know?” she joked.

“The women who have children my age are literally 20 years younger and that’s an interesting place to be because I’m not that age. And that’s totally OK. But I want to feel vital like that for my child.”

She added, “I’m just trying to stay alive just like every other mother. I’m just trying to keep it going.”

With the support of devoted husband Benji - who she married in 2015 and whose twin brother Joel is married to Nicole Richie - Cameron has managed to successfully maintain her Hollywood status, no mean feat for a woman in her fifties in the industry.

And fans can’t get enough of seeing her back on screen. ▶

“To see a naturally beautiful woman of a certain age represented is such a tonic,” one said.

Another added, “A beautiful woman ageing naturally is so refreshing for Hollywood.”

Since her unforgettable movie debut in 1994’s *The Mask*, she has been the go-to blonde bombshell character in films such as *Charlie’s Angels* and *There’s Something About Mary*.

But in the three decades since she started out, a lot has changed in Hollywood. The very nature of fame and who can become famous has altered dramatically. It’s something they address in *Outcome*, which premiered earlier this month.

“The world has changed. Being famous, becoming a celebrity, is something that is accessible to anyone now,” Cameron muses when discussing how celebrity culture has evolved.

“It could happen to anyone, whether they want it or not. Social media has changed everything. Everyone can have their 15 minutes of fame now. You don’t need to be in Hollywood. You just need to go viral or just make a video that receives a bunch of likes.

“It’s all relative to the person but it’s all a form of being famous for however long. Fame has become something that it feels like everybody is reaching for.”

But when it comes to navigating the pitfalls of fame, Cameron’s not forthcoming with good advice, probably because she’s successfully managed to enjoy a full life away from the cameras for so long.

“There is no handbook or manual on being famous,” she says. “You have to write your own and make it your own. Maybe reach out to other people that you admire. Discover how they do it.”

*Outcome* marks the second time Cameron has worked with Keanu, their first film being *Feeling Minnesota* in 1996. She jokes that she’d hoped he’d forgotten the experience.

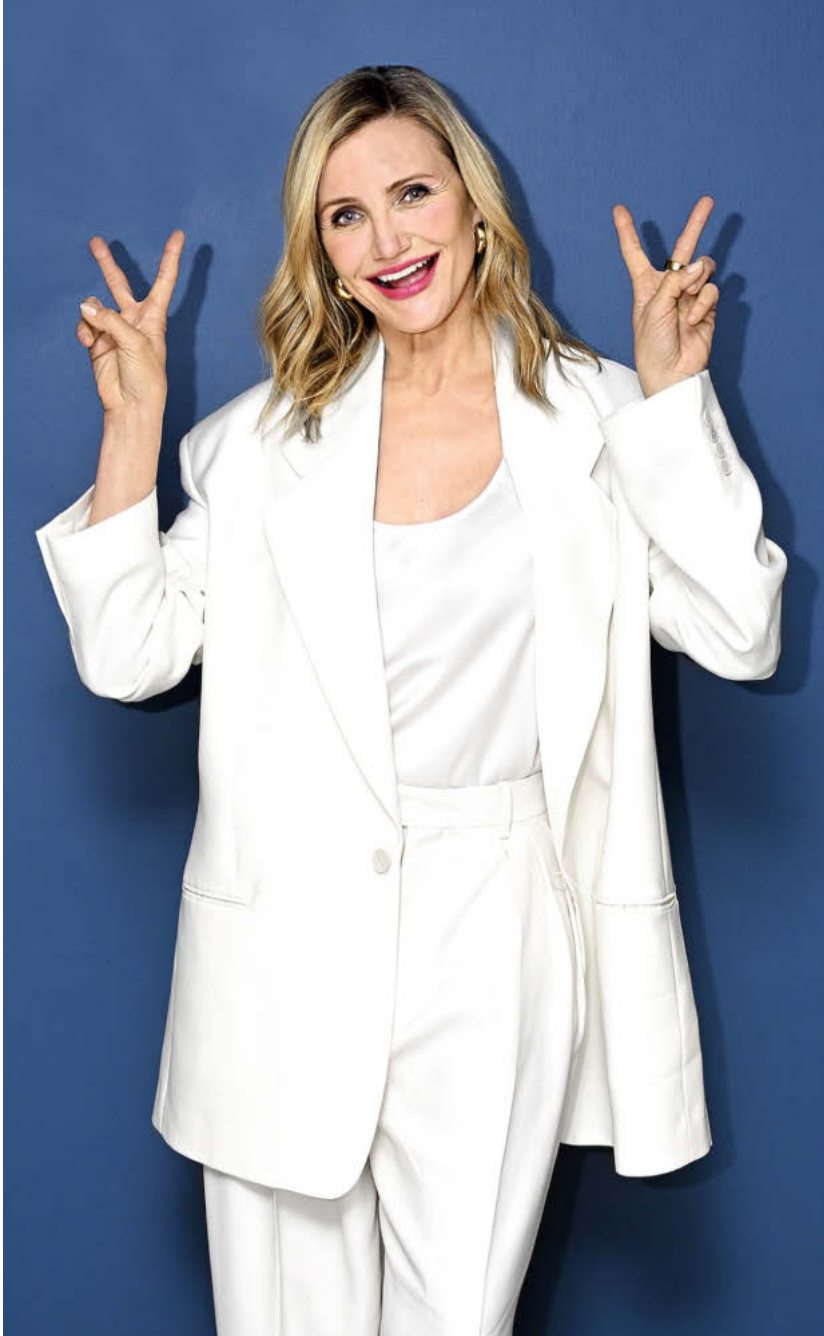
“My memories of it are that it was a long time ago! I think it was only my fourth film. I was so green. I was kind of hoping he had forgotten all about it but he hadn’t. He remembered,” she laughs, adding that the actor hadn’t changed at all in 30 years.

“All I can say is that Keanu is the same generous, lovely human being he was back then. He hasn’t changed at all. He is still the best to work with and still the best to play basketball with. It was just like old times. But I was so honoured to get to work with him again.”

With two kids at home, life is already busy for Cameron, but it’s about to get even more manic. Earlier this month she was pictured filming a new movie in New York with *The Office* legend Stephen Merchant, who she clearly adores.

While appearing on *The Tonight Show Starring Jimmy Fallon*, she gushed, “He’s so great. Gosh he’s the best.”

The film, reportedly titled *The Sham* will see the pair play unlikely lovers, whose fake marriage soon blossoms into a real romance.



## ‘THERE IS NO HANDBOOK ON BEING FAMOUS’

Stephen, who is clearly just as thrilled to be working with Cameron, said, “Having a great time making this movie in glorious NYC, can’t wait to share it.”

Cameron will also be starring in new Netflix film *Bad Day* in which she plays a single mother “having the worst day ever” and she’s said to be developing - and starring - in a sequel to the 1980s comedy *Troop Beverly Hills*.

Needless to say, after leaving the world of showbiz for so long, Cameron is now certainly making up for lost time. [OK!](#)

# ‘We’re still obsessed with weight – why can’t we just be who we are?’

Actress and writer *Gaynor Faye* on continuing her mum’s mission, why menopause matters and the legacy of hit show *Fat Friends*

**G**aynor Faye knows a thing or two about the concept of legacy. As well as her own standout career as an actress and scriptwriter, the 54-year-old took charge of her late mother Kay Mellor’s company, Rollem Productions, after her sudden death in 2022 at the age of 71. She’s been bearing the torch for the legendary screenwriter ever since.

“I’m just carrying on with getting my mum’s work out there,” Gaynor tells *OK!* with a smile.

Back in 2000, Kay’s comedy-drama *Fat Friends* hit the small screen. It followed a raggle-taggle group of slimming club members, played by the likes of James Corden, Ruth Jones, Alison Steadman and Gaynor herself, as they faced the highs and lows of their lives, and learned to love their bodies.

The show was a huge hit, and connected with people across all generations. Gaynor says she is “so chuffed” that so many people have seen and loved her mother’s show. And with the rise in weight-loss jabs and the revival of “heroin chic”, it couldn’t be more relevant two decades later.

Gaynor, who says she still misses her mum “terribly”, explains, “Mum wrote something because people were obsessed with weight, and they still are. Too big, too small, too fat, too thin, too this, too that - why can’t we just be who we are, as long

as we’re healthy? Let’s just accept ourselves and get rid of all this.”

Before Kay’s untimely death, she penned a *Fat Friends* musical, which Gaynor is trying to get produced - not just because it’s her mother’s work, but because she believes wholeheartedly in the story’s core message.

“There’s only one you. I am me, and I’m never going to be somebody else, and I love who I am. I think that’s the biggest message my mum wanted to get out there, and I still want to get out there - love who

you are, whatever your shape or size.”

For Gaynor, and many *Fat Friends* fans, the show will always have a place in their hearts. The actress, who has two children - son Oliver and daughter Lily Mae - with her long-term partner Mark Pickering, has been told by some that a show focusing so heavily on the comings and goings in a weight-loss club could never be made today, but she wholeheartedly disagrees.

“People go, ‘Oh, *Fat Friends* - you won’t be able to put that on now.’ Well, actually, it’s amazing, and it’s pro ‘love who you are, be yourself’. The show was actually an attack on the diet industry, not anything other than that. We want people to feel that whoever they are, whatever shape or size they are, they’re beautiful.”

The characters were certainly beautiful inside and out. James Corden’s Jamie was someone Gaynor says “everyone fell in love with”, while Ruth Jones’ Kelly was not only a gorgeous girl but “everything that people wanted to be”, due to her vivacity and joie de vivre.

“These are all multifaceted characters, and my mum was brilliant at writing those,” Gaynor reminisces.

*Fat Friends* wasn’t just a place where Gaynor and her mother could highlight how beautiful people are, whatever their weight - it was also a vehicle Kay could use to foster new talent, and it ultimately led to the creation of another iconic show, ▶

the legendary sitcom *Gavin & Stacey*.

“Ruth, James and Alison all met while working on *Fat Friends*, and Ruth and James started to write *Gavin & Stacey* because they saw how much viewers loved authentic characters,” Gaynor says. “Real people in real situations, that’s what audiences want to see.”

According to Gaynor, it was late in the run of *Fat Friends* that Ruth and James first started talking about writing *Gavin & Stacey*, which they would both also star in, along with Alison.

Over the years to follow, James and Ruth’s partnership would result in one of the most successful comedy shows in UK history. But before that, James and co-star Lisa Riley were the ones who’d do sketches.

“I’ve never laughed more than when I was on set with James and Lisa,” Gaynor recalls. “It was hysterical. James is very funny and very talented.”

And what of Ruth, the future Vanessa Shanessa Jenkins? “The thing is, Ruth is just gorgeous with it. She’s a beautiful person and can turn her hand to anything. Ruth asked my mum if she could write on the show, and if my mum would mentor her, which she did. Ruth learned how to structure, how to write, and then she teamed up with James and they started

talking about this great idea. My mum put them together,” says Gaynor proudly.

Gaynor herself has gone on to feature in some memorable shows. She’s a veritable soap queen, having starred in *Emmerdale* and *Coronation Street*, as well as dramas *Playing The Field* and *The Syndicate*. Most recently, she worked on a film, *Hot Flash*, about women going through menopause.

“I’m going through the menopause myself,” Gaynor explains of her connection to the film. “My group of friends are, too. I’m of an age where my friends are all in it.

“A lot of people can find menopause debilitating and scary, especially due to symptoms like brain fog, which can feel like a kind of early dementia. But you know what? There are parts of it that are actually wonderful.”

In particular, Gaynor loves the feeling of just not caring any more. “For a total people-pleaser like me, it’s great to have the ability to go, ‘Do you know what? I’m going to do this for myself. I’m not going to worry about that any more.’

“Menopause used to be a real taboo,” she continues - although she has never understood why. “Every woman is going to go through this, and every man is going to experience their mother, wife, daughter or sister going through it.

Everybody will be affected by menopause at some point in their life, so why don’t we talk about it more? It’s crazy.”

Gaynor thinks it’s wonderful that big-name celebrities such as Davina McCall and Lisa Snowdon are so open about their experiences - and that we have a dedicated Menopause Awareness Month.

“Everybody needs to know about it,” she says. “Not that we should ram it down people’s throats, but as you would talk about anything that affects that number of people in that kind of way. Let’s get the resources out there - the tools women need to get through it.”

Gaynor herself went to a private doctor when she started experiencing menopause symptoms, and while she’s grateful she was able to do that, she’s well aware that not everyone can afford it.

“We should normalise menopause and get help out there - not help that you have to sneakily go and find,” she says. “Support should be accessible for everybody, because half the population will go through it. I’m very passionate about it.” **OK!**

# Late night delights

If you're laying on a cheeseboard for an evening wedding reception, or want to offer guests treats to take home, these make-in-advance recipes are easy wins



## Red Fox scones

**MAKES 8**

These fluffy cheese scones will upgrade any wedding reception cheeseboard. Using M&S's sweet, nutty and rich Vintage Red Fox Red Leicester cheese lends them a delicious depth of flavour and beautiful colour. Serve with slices of cheese and a dollop of onion chutney for a savoury treat.

### Ingredients

225g plain white flour

3 tsp baking powder  
1 tsp salt  
1 tsp English mustard powder  
½ tsp cayenne pepper  
50g cold unsalted British butter  
125g Red Leicester cheese such as M&S Vintage Red Fox, grated  
10g fresh chives, finely chopped  
70ml whole milk  
1 free-range egg, beaten

### To serve

Butter, cheese and chutneys

1. Preheat the oven to 220°C/200°C fan/gas mark 7. Combine the flour, baking

powder, salt, mustard powder and cayenne pepper in a large bowl.

2. Grate in the butter, then rub in with your fingertips to fully combine.
3. Add most of the cheese, saving a large handful to scatter on top, and stir in the chives.
4. Combine the milk and 60ml water. Carefully mix in until the dough just comes together, being careful not to overwork.
5. Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured work surface

and flatten it down into a 2.5cm rectangle. Use a fluted 8cm cutter to cut out 8 circles (you may need to re-roll the dough). Place on a greaseproof-lined flat baking sheet.

6. Brush over the beaten egg, then top with a little extra grated cheese.
7. Bake for around 12-14 minutes, until well risen and golden. These are delicious served alongside a cheeseboard (or a cheese tower), with a range of chutneys.

## Ultimate chocolate fridge cake

SERVES 16

A small square or two of this in a ribbon-tied cellophane bag will make a thoughtful guest favour.

### Ingredients

125g milk chocolate, chopped  
100g 85% dark chocolate, chopped  
125g unsalted British butter, diced  
125g golden syrup  
300g oat crunch or digestive biscuits, broken into 1cm pieces  
95g chocolate-covered pretzels, roughly chopped  
150g mixed nuts and raisins, roughly chopped

### To decorate

75g milk chocolate  
50g 85% dark chocolate  
75g white chocolate

1. Line the base and sides of a 20cm square tin with baking parchment. Tip the milk chocolate and dark chocolate into a large heatproof bowl.
2. Add the butter and golden syrup and set the bowl over a pan of barely simmering water to melt. Stir until smooth, remove from the heat and leave to cool slightly.
3. Combine the broken biscuit pieces, pretzels, nuts and raisins in a bowl.
4. Pour in the melted chocolate and mix to combine. Spoon into the tin and spread level. Cover the surface with a sheet of baking parchment and press flat using a flat-bottomed ramekin or a glass. Leave at room temperature for about 2 hours to cool and firm, then chill for 20 minutes.
5. For the topping, melt the milk, dark and white chocolate in separate bowls. Stir until smooth and leave to cool slightly. Using a teaspoon, drop random dollops of milk chocolate over the top of the chilled cake, then do the same with the dark and white chocolate, filling in the gaps. Gently shake the tin to level the chocolate, then marble the chocolates together using a wooden skewer.
6. Chill for about 30 minutes, or until the chocolate has set. Using the lining paper, carefully lift the fridge cake out of the tin and cut into squares or fingers to serve.



## Ibérico and Manchego cheese twists

MAKES 12

Flaky, golden and dangerously moreish, this simple puff pastry twist recipe is loaded with rich Ibérico ham and nutty Manchego cheese for the ultimate savoury snack. Made with all-butter pastry for that perfect melt-in-the-mouth finish, they make a tasty treat for buffets or a delicious canapé, and go wonderfully with a glass of champagne or cava.

### Ingredients

1 sheet all-butter puff pastry  
100g Manchego cheese, grated  
70g M&S Collection Spanish Ibérico ham, roughly torn  
1 free-range egg, beaten

1. Preheat the oven to 220°C/200°C fan/gas mark 7. On a lightly

floured work surface, roll out the puff pastry sheet to 0.5cm thick. With the longest side facing you, sprinkle the Manchego cheese on top and evenly scatter over pieces of Ibérico ham, then use your rolling pin to lightly press the cheese and ham into the pastry. Season with salt and pepper. Pop into the fridge until cold.

2. Cutting from top to bottom of the pastry, slice into 12 short strips. Carefully twist each pastry strip by twisting each end in the opposite direction, until you have a curly straw shape.
3. Add the cheese and ham twists to a large baking sheet and brush with the beaten egg. Bake for 15-20 minutes, until golden and crisp.

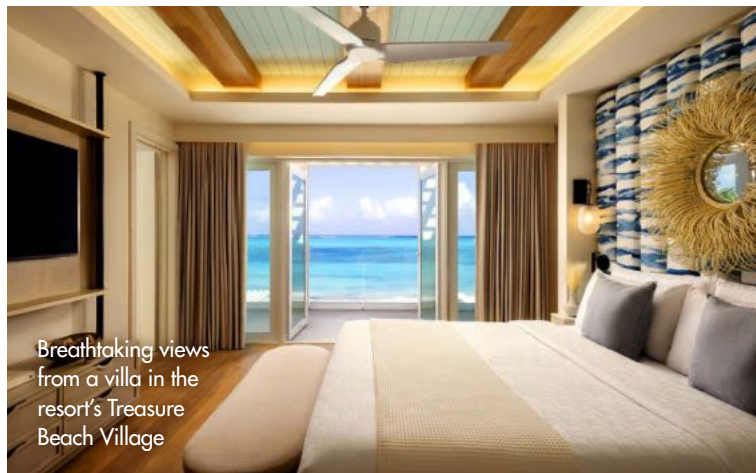

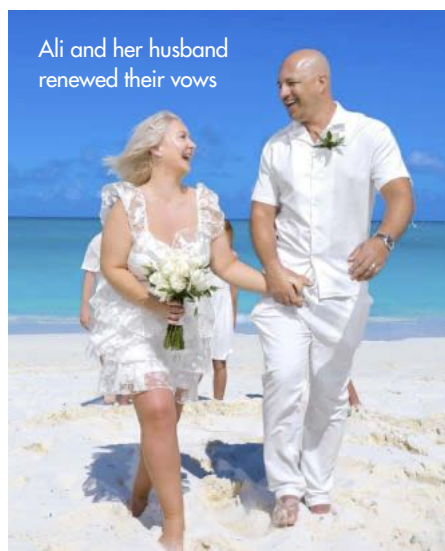
## THE RESORT
